## How to apply for Russian Scholarship (easy step-by-step guide)

## Stage 1. Filling out the application form

- 1. Register at <u>www.russia.study</u>.
- 2. Fill out all the required fields in the application form. You may choose up to six universities by order of preference, but not more than two from Moscow or St, Petersburg.

Do not tick the (Russian) "compatriot" status.

- 3. Attach the documents in accordance with the list:
  - passport biodata pages (must be valid at least until April 2021);
  - secondary (for undergraduates) or higher education (for postgraduate studies) certificate;
  - academic record;
  - medical certificate of good health to the effect that its bearer is fit to study in Russia; basic medical tests depending on the field of study;
  - HIV negative certificate;
  - Any other document the applicant may deem useful for their evaluation.

Note: All documents to be submitted to this Embassy must be legalized at the national MFA or apostilled by respective national authorities and duly translated into Russian. The Embassy staff does not provide translation services.

## Stage 2. Review of the documents and evaluation

Upon preliminary review of the application and documents, the Embassy staff will contact you through <u>www.russia.study</u> to provide further guidance.

## Note: you may be invited to undergo an interview.

Once all applications are finalized and reviewed, the Embassy will choose the brightest applicants and forward their personal files to the Ministry of Education.

Note: if you were not selected for scholarship but you still wish to study, you may apply to Russian universities directly. In this case tuition fees apply.
