Entrance Scholarships and Merit Awards

We have a long history of offering Scholarships at Aberystwyth. The Entrance Scholarship competition offers four opportunities to benefit simply by sitting two exams:

Faculty Scholarships £2,000 a year

We have 20 Faculty Scholarships available, which are worth £2,000 a year, as well as a reduced offer* to study at the University and guaranteed accommodation in a University property for the duration of the course**. Our academic faculties allocate these awards based on excellent performance in the Entrance Scholarship exams.

2. University Scholarships - £1,000 a year

We have 50 University Scholarships to award to the candidates scoring the highest aggregate marks of both examination papers. Successful candidates receive £1,000 for each year of their course. University Scholarship holders also receive a reduced offer* to study at the University, and guaranteed accommodation in a University property throughout the length of their course**.

3. Merit Awards

- £1,000 in the first year

We offer approximately 250 Merit Awards each year to students who do well in the Entrance Scholarship competition but narrowly miss out on attaining a Scholarship. Merit Award holders receive £1,000 during the first year of their course, as well as a reduced offer* to study at the University.

4. Reduced offers*

All Scholars and Merit Award holders will receive a reduced offer. A reduction equivalent to three A level grades or 24 UCAS tariff points will be applied to the offer the candidate is holding (e.g. a BBB A level offer would be reduced to CCC). Reductions will apply to candidates studying A levels, Welsh Baccalaureate Advanced Diplomas, BTEC Level 3 Diplomas, or combinations of these qualifications. Reduced offers for other qualifications will be made at the discretion of the University.

Candidates who do not receive an award may be given a reduced offer on the basis of their strong performance in the Entrance Scholarship competition.

Please note that it is only possible to receive one award as a result of sitting the Entrance Scholarship examinations.

** In order to secure your guaranteed place in Residence, you must apply for accommodation for the following academic year within dates advertised by the Accommodation Office for returning students

Examination Subjects

Entrance Scholarship examinations must be taken in two of the following subjects. Unless otherwise indicated, the scope of the examination is similar to that of A levels, but does not follow any particular syllabus. It's important to ensure that the subjects you choose are relevant to the degree scheme you have applied for.

Which subjects should I choose?

In order to be considered for an award and/or a reduced offer it is important to select exam papers which are acceptable to the Department(s) you have applied to study in. It is your responsibility to ensure you have selected appropriate subjects. Please also see our website for details about individual exam papers: www.aber.ac.uk/scholarships/

Name of Department	
Art	If a candidate is applying for a degree scheme that includes Fine Art - for example, Joint Honours in Art History and Fine Art - they must submit a Portfolio of their art work as one of their Entrance Scholarship subjects.
Biological, Environmental & Rural Sciences (IBERS)	Applicants should select at least one exam paper which is directly related to the course they are applying for. If candidates are uncertain regarding choices, they can contact IBERS admissions on ibers-admissions@aber.ac.uk for guidance.
Business School	Although applicants to the Business School are encouraged to consider selecting the paper for the subject which they have applied to study, any subject combination is acceptable.
Computer Science	Candidates who have applied for a course that includes Computer Science must take at least one of the Computer Science or Information Technology papers.
Education	The exam paper is suitable both for candidates currently studying for a qualification in Education and those who have an interest in the subject. Although applicants to the Department are encouraged to consider selecting this paper, any subject combination is acceptable.
English and Creative Writing	Applicants to the Department of English and Creative Writing are expected to take one or both of the papers we offer: Creative Writing (in English) and English Literature. Although applicants are encouraged to take both papers they may choose to take one of these papers in combination with any other subject.
Geography and Earth Sciences	Applicants to Geography and Earth Sciences are expected to sit at least one of the Physical Geography, Human Geography, or Geology papers.
History and Welsh History	Applicants to the Department of History and Welsh History are required to take at least one of the papers we offer: History - British Isles and History - Europe and America. Although applicants are encouraged to consider taking both papers they may choose to take one of these papers in combination with any other subject.

International Politics	Applicants to the Department of International Politics are required to take at least one of the papers we offer: Politics and International Politics. Although applicants are encouraged to consider taking both papers they may choose to take one of these papers in combination with any other subject.
Law School	Although applicants to the Law School are encouraged to consider selecting the Law / Criminology papers, any subject combination is acceptable.
Mathematics	Candidates who have applied for a course that includes mathematics must take the Mathematics paper as one of their subject options.
Modern Languages	If applicants are studying the modern language to A level standard they will be expected to select that language as one of their subject options.
Physics	Scholarship applicants intending to study Physics must take the Physics paper as one of their options. If candidates are taking A level Mathematics they can choose any other subject for their second paper. However, candidates not taking A level Maths should choose Mathematics as their second paper.
Psychology	Although applicants to the Department are encouraged to consider selecting the Psychology paper, any subject combination is acceptable.
Theatre, Film and Television Studies	Any applicant for a single or joint honours course in Drama and Theatre Studies will be expected to take the Drama and Theatre Studies paper as one of their subject options. Any applicant for a single or joint honours course in Film and Television Studies will be expected to take the Film and Television exam paper as one of their subject options.
Welsh and Celtic Studies	Applicants to study Welsh are encouraged to choose one of the two scholarship papers, either the Cymraeg laith Fodern paper for second language Welsh speakers, or the Cymraeg laith Gyntaf paper, in the case of first language Welsh speakers.

Dates of Examinations

The exams will be held on **Tuesday, 29th January 2019**. Candidates will sit one paper during the morning session and the other during the afternoon session. The exam timetable is available on the website (if both of your subjects are timetabled for the same session you will sit one of the papers in the morning and the other paper in the afternoon). Unfortunately, applicants will **NOT** be able to sit the exams on any other day.

How to Apply (if you live in the UK)

- The closing date for applications to the Entrance Scholarship competition is 18th January 2019. You can apply quickly and easily using the online form on our website (from October 2018 onwards) or complete a paper application form and email or post it to us.
- You will receive an email to confirm that we have received your application form. If you have not received an email three working days after submitting your form please get in touch with us. The email acknowledgement is proof that we have received your application, and any issues cannot be rectified after the closing date.
- If you have any specific exam requirements for your normal school examinations (e.g. extra time, use of a PC) you should note this on your application form. If you wish to sit the examinations in Aberystwyth you MUST also submit with your application a letter/email from your school/college confirming that these arrangements are in place for your normal school examinations. How to Apply (if you live outside of the UK)

The closing date for applications for candidates who live outside of the UK is 15th January 2019. You will need to complete a paper application form and email or post it to us (we cannot accept online applications from candidates who live outside of the UK). Please note that late applications will NOT be accepted.

Location of examinations:

You can choose to sit the exams either.

At Aberystwyth University

Candidates wishing to come to Aberystwyth to sit the exams will need to make their own travel and accommodation arrangements. However, we will be able to make a financial contribution towards your arrangements. If you opt to sit the exams in Aberystwyth we will send you full details of the arrangements in due course.

At Your School/College

If you prefer to sit the exams at your school/college (in the UK) you are welcome to do so, provided your Exams Officer confirms they are willing to make the necessary arrangements. You **MUST** obtain their permission before submitting your application form

It is the responsibility of the **applicant** to liaise with their Exams Officer **BEFORE** the day of the exams to ensure that the correct exam papers have been received and that appropriate arrangements have been made (e.g. regarding the exam room, invigilator etc.). Any errors notified to the University after the exams have been timetabled to take place cannot be rectified



Entrance Scholarship examinations may only be taken outside of the UK either:

- At a school/college which has been accredited to hold UK exam board examinations (e.g. WJEC, Cambridge, AQA). You MUST provide evidence of this accreditation with your application form to show that your school/college is eligible. Applications received without this evidence will NOT be accepted.

Mature Applicants

We welcome applications from mature candidates but please note that you cannot enter the competition if you have already been a student at any University for more than one semester.

Please note that although you must have applied to study at Aberystwyth University by the closing date of 18th January, you do not need to wait to receive an offer before you can apply to sit the Entrance Scholarship exams.

Deferred Entry

If you intend to defer your application to the University you can sit the exams and defer any award alongside your deferred entry to the University. Alternatively, you may prefer to sit the exams whilst you're on your year out.



What is Involved?

Entrance Scholarships and Merit Awards are open to applicants studying any degree scheme at Aberystwyth. You will be required to sit **TWO** exams from the choice of subjects we offer. Each exam lasts for an hour and a half. The exams are set and marked by our academic departments, so they don't follow any particular syllabus, but they should be a similar standard to A level exams.

Please note that prior to 2017 the exams lasted for 2 hours, therefore the format of the papers

Special Examination Arrangements

may vary slightly from 2017 onwards.

Candidates who have specific examination requirements for their normal school examinations (e.g. extra time, use of a PC) must submit with their application a letter/email from their school confirming their

requirements. Eligible candidates may be entitled to 25% extra time, and arrangements as per normal school examinations, please see our policy on making reasonable adjustments for applicants sitting the Entrance Scholarship examinations:

Results

Results will be posted to all candidates and their schools/colleges approximately 4 weeks after the exams have taken place. If you are offered a Scholarship or a Merit Award, you will need to place Aberystwyth as your Firm choice of University via UCAS in order to accept the award (see the Regulations for the only exceptions). The University publishes details of successful award holders and the names of their schools/colleges on our website and in other publications from time to time. If candidates do not wish to have their name published, they should ensure that they have indicated so on their application form.

Payment of Awards

When you start your course at the University we will ask you to enter your bank details onto your



Student Record. Payments will then be made direct to you via BACS in two equal instalments for each eligible year – the first payment will be at the start of December, and the second payment will be at the start of March. Merit Award payments are made during the first year only. Entrance Scholarship payments will continue for each eligible year of your course provided that you have achieved an attendance rate of at least 70% in your first year (lectures, seminars, workshops, practicals etc).

Schools and Colleges

Information for schools and colleges, including details of procedures to be followed in special circumstances (e.g. if the school/college has to close due to bad weather) can be found on our website: www.aber.ac.uk/scholarships/schools

All exam papers and materials for the examinations will be sent to the nominated Examinations Officer approximately one week before the exams.

There is no charge associated with sitting the Entrance Scholarship examinations, but the University is unable to contribute to any invigilation or room booking costs which may be incurred. If you only have one candidate sitting the exams you will not need to invigilate them continuously over the duration of the exams (provided they are in a secure room/office and do not have access to the internet, books, reference materials, mobile or electronic devices). Normal exam arrangements apply.

Benefactors

The provision of our Entrance Scholarships have been made possible by generous donations from a number of benefactors over the years. Some awards have restrictions placed on who can receive them. It is not necessary to apply for a specific Scholarship – if your exam results are sufficiently high we will award a suitable Scholarship to you. However, you should let us know if you are the son of a Nonconformist Minister and therefore eligible for consideration for the David Morgan Thomas of Caterham Memorial Scholarship.

Entrance Scholarship Regulations

- Scholarships and Merit Awards are open to candidates who will have attained the age of 17 by 1st October in the year of proposed entry to university.
- Candidates must submit an application form to the Recruitment and Marketing Office before 18th January noting the two subjects in which they wish to be examined and the course of study they wish to pursue. Candidates may not sit papers in a combination of subjects unacceptable to their proposed department of study.
- 3. A candidate who is awarded a scholarship must, as a condition of his/her acceptance of the Award, accept the University as his/her 'firm' choice through UCAS. The University reserves the right to withdraw the Scholarship should the candidate place the University as his/her 'insurance' choice. The exception to this will be for candidates holding offers from the Universities of Oxford or Cambridge, or who have applied for a Veterinary Science course, where Aberystwyth can be held as the Insurance choice.
- No candidate shall be admitted to the examination if he/she has been a degree student at any university or university college for more than one semester.
- The examinations are designed for candidates in Year 13 or equivalent. A higher standard will be required from any candidate who has completed two years in the sixth form or equivalent. Applications from mature candidates are also encouraged.
- The Senate reserves the right of withholding any award if it is found that there is no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The Senate reserves the right of dividing any scholarship in case of equality.
- The University reserves the right to withdraw an Entrance Scholarship application for any applicant to whom they are unable to offer a place to study. Whilst

- every effort will be made to identify such candidates at the earliest opportunity, it is possible that this decision may be made after the examinations have been taken, for example when the UCAS application has been received close to the closing date for Entrance Scholarship competition and has not been fully reviewed before the date of the examinations. Please note that the results of the Entrance Scholarship examinations will have no bearing on this decision - the decision on whether or not to offer a place to study will be made purely on the basis of information contained within the applicant's UCAS application form.
- 9. In order to avoid potential issues in terms of accepting an award, candidates are advised not to place any other institution as their Firm choice via UCAS until they receive the results of the Entrance Scholarship competition. Candidates will receive their Scholarship results before mid-March.
- 10. In the case where a Department is unable to offer a candidate a place to study on their first choice of course but instead offers a place to study on a similar course which includes a foundation year, any award will be applicable to that amended scheme only.
- 11. Where a candidate has applied for a scheme which includes a foundation year and is offered a place on that course, any award received will be applicable to that scheme only, and will not be automatically transferable to a 3 year degree scheme.
- 12. The Senate reserves the right to modify any award in the event of a candidate obtaining an award from another body.
- 13. Entrance Scholarship and Faculty Entrance Scholarship payments will continue for each eligible year of the course provided that an attendance rate of at least 70% in the first year (lectures, seminars, workshops, practicals etc) has been achieved.

- 14. The Senate will reduce or totally withhold an award if the holder has not made distinct progress in his/her studies as certified by his/her teachers and as shown in the Terminal and Sessional examinations of the University, or if his/her conduct and diligence have not been satisfactory.
- Payments are not made during years abroad, years in employment, sandwich years, repeat years etc.
- 16. Scholarship holders shall be active in raising awareness of the University by engaging with promotional schemes where appropriate (e.g. visits to schools/colleges, Open Days, Visiting Days, Widening Participation activities). For engagement in these activities, the scholarship holder will need to register with AberWorks and will be recompensed at the standard student ambassador rate (further information on these opportunities will be advertised during the academic year).
- 17. The Scholarships will be subject to the general regulations governing the award and tenure of University Entrance Scholarships. The tenure of all awards is subject to the Standing Orders of the Senate.

Please note it is only possible to receive one award as a result of sitting the Entrance Scholarship exams.

Academic Excellence Scholarships

£2,000

In order to reward academic excellence achieved prior to beginning at the University, we are pleased to offer Academic Excellence Scholarships worth £2,000 in the first year of study to applicants from the UK/EU who place Aberystwyth University as their Firm choice through UCAS and go on to achieve at least:

- Grades AAA at A level*
- D*D*D* in the BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma
- 36 points in the International Baccalaureate
- Please see the Scholarship pages on the website for details of additional qualifications which are accepted for this award

There is no need to apply, awards will automatically be allocated to eligible students.

* Grade A in the Welsh Baccalaureate Advanced Diploma, to include the Advanced Skills Challenge Certificate, may be accepted in lieu of one of the A level grades.



Rashid Domingo Bursaries

up to £12,000

The Rashid Domingo Bursaries have been made possible by a generous gift to the University by Mr Rashid Domingo.

Having created a number of scholarships and bursaries in his native South Africa, Mr Domingo is keen to turn his philanthropic interests to Wales and Welsh students and wishes to assist able and deserving candidates to achieve their academic potential. Mr Domingo hopes that recipients of the Bursary will be inspired to consider supporting other students in a similar way in the future.

The Bursaries are open to undergraduate applicants wishing to study in the Department of Physics or IBERS. Candidates must have attended secondary school/college in Wales

for a period of at least 3 years. The aim of the Bursary is to assist students who may otherwise be prevented from attending university due to financial considerations.

During the first year of study, the award will normally be a contribution of up to £4,000 towards the student's accommodation in a University residence. In years 2 and 3, payments of £4,000 will be made in 3 instalments direct to the recipient's bank account (£1,500 in October, £1,500 in December, and £1,000 in March).

Emily Price Scholarship

£500

This Scholarship has been established by the family and friends of former student, Emily Price, to reward female applicants to Mathematics or Physics courses (including joint honours Mathematics/Physics) at Aberystwyth. The successful candidate will demonstrate academic promise and a passion for increasing the involvement of women in mathematics and/or Physics. The Scholarship will be payable during the first year of study.

Candidates must apply for an eligible course by 15th January 2019 and hold Aberystwyth as their Firm choice of university. They must also complete and submit the Emily Price Scholarship application form by 31st January 2019 and may be required to attend a short interview to discuss their application during an Applicant Visiting Day in February or March 2019.

Departmental Awards

Department of Computer Science

Departmental Scholarships to pursue studies in Computer Science

Single Honours: £500 per year Joint Honours: £250 per year

Up to three scholarships are available to students who achieve excellent grades in the Entrance Scholarship exams or achieve excellent (A*) grades in their A levels or equivalent. The level of the award is £500 per year for the duration of your degree scheme (three or four years) giving a total award of up to £7,500 (if including a Faculty Entrance Scholarship).

The award is retained providing an exam average of 70% or above is achieved each year. Joint honours students are eligible for £250 per year.

Department of Mathematics

Departmental Scholarships to pursue studies in Mathematics

Single Honours: £500 per year Major subject of Major/Minor: £500 per year Joint Honours: £250 per year

To qualify, an applicant must be either in receipt of a University Entrance Scholarship in Mathematics, or achieve grade A* in A level Mathematics.

The level of the award is £500 per year for single honours and major-minor students (with the major in mathematics), and £250 per year for joint honours students.

The award is automatically given to students meeting the above criteria, and is retained



provided an exam average of 70% or above in Mathematics modules is achieved each year.

Department of Physics

Departmental Scholarships to pursue studies in Physics

Single Honours: £500 per year Joint Honours: £250 per year

To qualify, an applicant must be either in receipt of a University Entrance Scholarship in Physics or Mathematics, or achieve at least two A grades at A level, one of which must be Physics. The level of the award is £500 per year for duration of your degree scheme (three or four years) giving a total award of up to £7,500 (including a Faculty Entrance Scholarship).

The award is retained providing an exam average of 70% or above is achieved each year. Joint honours students are eligible for £250 per year. For further details contact the Department of Physics: phys@aber.ac.uk

Aberystwyth Bursaries

£500 a year

Our means-tested bursary programme is targeted to support widening participation in higher education and we are committed to equality of opportunity for all students. We have, therefore, allocated a proportion of our fee income to create a bursary scheme to assist full-time undergraduate students from the United Kingdom and the European Union. If your residual household income is £35,000 or below you will be entitled to receive £500 a year towards your living costs.

Eligible applicants from the UK will receive the bursary automatically. Please ensure you opt to 'share' your information on the relevant form when applying for student finance; the University will then receive the financial assessment of your household income made by the relevant Student Finance company and will use this to assess your entitlement to the bursary.

Applicants from the EU (outside the UK) should ensure they complete and return the relevant

student finance form, which will be sent by the Student Finance EU Customer Services Team once you have returned the standard tuition fee support form for new students.

Additional Support

The Aberystwyth University Hardship Fund is open to full-time UK, EU and international domiciled students and is a discretionary fund that provides support to students in genuine financial need.

The fund is designed to assist with priority expenses such as living costs and accommodation. Allowances may also be made for course related costs where there is no additional funding available, for example fieldtrips, study equipment/materials, attendance at interviews.

Sports Scholarships

£500 a year

Sports Scholarships are intended for students who are normally resident in the UK or EU and who can demonstrate recent achievement of a high standard in their chosen sport, and commitment to performance development.

Sports Scholarships are available to students applying for ANY full-time course at Aberystwyth.

The benefits of Sports Scholarships are:

- £500 a year (up to 10 awards available annually)
- Free Platinum membership of the University Sports Centre for each year of study
- Guaranteed accommodation in a Hall of Residence / University managed property for the duration of the course*

*In order to secure your guaranteed place in Residence, you must apply for accommodation for the following academic year within dates advertised by the Accommodation Office for returning students.

How to apply

- Students will need to have applied through UCAS by 30th June 2019 and hold Aberystwyth University as their Firm choice of university.
- Students will need to complete and return an application form by 30th June 2019.
- Applicants may be invited to attend an interview to discuss their application further
- Applications can be submitted via the online application form or by downloading a form from the Scholarships section of the website.
- Students must meet the terms of their offer in full.

Sports Scholarships can be held with any other undergraduate award.

Conditions to be fulfilled by Sports Scholarship holders

- Scholarship holders will be required to meet all the terms of their offer in full.
- Scholarship holders will be expected to contribute
 to a Students' Union Sports Club and would
 normally be expected to represent the University
 in the sport for which the Scholarship was
 awarded. In some circumstances this requirement
 may not be appropriate or possible and can be
 waived by agreement of the Chair of the Awarding
 Panel. Scholarship holders are asked to confirm
 their availability upon acceptance of the award.
- Holders of the Scholarship should agree to behave in a fashion befitting a representative of the University and attempt to maintain or improve their sporting performance.
- 4. Scholarship holders shall provide help in promoting the sporting profile of the University and will assist in other schemes which involve the promotion of the University e.g. Open Days, Visiting Days, Widening Participation activities, where appropriate. The student will be recompensed for hours worked at the standard student ambassador rate.
- 5. The Scholarship holder will have the opportunity to review their progress with the Student Activities Co-ordinator and may also be required to keep a training diary to help with the review process. The administration of the assessment and progression process will be undertaken by the Secretary of the Awarding Panel, and the review process will be administered by the Sports Scholarship Mentor.
- 6. Scholarship holders will be expected to submit short written progress reports (on an appropriate template which will be provided) at the end of their first semester, and at the end of each year of study. Scholarship holders must also inform the Sports Scholarship Mentor should any change in circumstances result in them being unable to continue to participate in their chosen sport during their time at the University.
- Payments will not be made during years abroad, years in employment, sandwich years, repeat years etc.
- 8. Holders of the Scholarship will continue to receive the benefits as long as they are full-time students.
- Unsatisfactory progress in any of these areas, without good cause, will result in termination of the award.

Sports Merit Awards

£500

If you excel in your sport **after** arriving at Aberystwyth University, you could apply for a Sports Merit Award in your second or subsequent year of study. Awards are worth £500 plus free Platinum membership of the University Sports Centre for one academic year.



Aberystwyth University / Aberystwyth Town Football Scholarships £4,000 a year plus additional benefits

Applications are invited from male candidates from the UK who are applying to study full-time for a degree in any subject (undergraduate or postgraduate). They are awarded on the basis of competitive audition to new entrants in any discipline (undergraduate or postgraduate) and held for the duration of the course.

The benefits of Music Scholarships:

- £650 a year (four or more awards available annually)
- Free membership of all Music Centre ensembles and affiliated ensembles (including orchestras, bands, etc.)
- Free use of Music Centre practice, library and other appropriate facilities
- Guaranteed accommodation in a University managed property for the duration of the course*

Bursaries for Care Leavers, Young Carers and related groups

Aberystwyth University is aware of the financial difficulties faced by students entering higher education who have previously been in care or who have caring responsibilities, or who are estranged from families and guardians in their late teenage years. In order to ease this financial pressure, we are pleased to introduce the following:

Students who declare in their UCAS application that they are in care, are a recognised young carer, or are recently estranged from their family/guardian due to other widening access criteria may be eligible to receive this additional payment (regardless of any other bursary or scholarship held with us).

For a Full Bursary* - £1,500 per annum*

An applicant must be able to demonstrate that:

- they have been in foster or other public care for a continuous period of 6 months or more after the age of 14, and be under 25 years of age when commencing their HE studies, with a Pathway Plan where appropriate,
- OR that they are a recognised young carer for a parent or sibling or nearest relative, in financial hardship and under the age of 21 when commencing their HE studies,
- OR that they have become estranged from their family/guardian(s) after the age of 16, are independent and self-supporting, in financial hardship, and under the age of 21 when commencing their HE studies.

*This amount is based on the anticipated accommodation costs for vacation periods, additional costs of items for independent living such as duvet, sheets, crockery, cutlery etc (which can be made available on arrival), plus course books and other study materials. It is assumed that students would find vacation employment to meet additional living costs.

For a Part Bursary** - £800 per annum**

An applicant must be able to demonstrate that:

- they have been in foster or other public care for a continuous period of 3 to 6 months at or after the age of 16, affecting their secondary schooling, and be under 25 years of age when commencing their HE studies.
- ** This amount is based on an understanding that young people who have been in Care intermittently or for a period of 3-6 months are likely to have experienced serious disruption to their education, in addition to other aspects of their lives. This award would provide them with the means to reside at the University for part of the vacation period and could enable them to become independent if they so choose.

For both awards:

 Bursaries will be awarded to all qualifying full-time UK domiciled undergraduates who meet the terms of their offer, irrespective of year of entry, and is in addition to other forms of statutory and institutional support.

- 2. The award is tenable for the normal duration of their scheme of study (for a maximum of 4 years) and subject to satisfactory academic progress.
- Application is by completion of a short form supported by documentation from social services, third sector provider or other relevant individual or body (completed in September of the year of entry or, where appropriate, on discussion, during the first year of study), and a short meeting with the 'Named Person' at Aberystwyth University (see contact details below).

In addition to financial support, Care Leavers and others are also offered to a number of other support measures including:

- Guaranteed accommodation in a Hall of Residence/University managed property for the duration of the course. (In order to secure your guaranteed place in Residence for all years, including summer accommodation, you must apply for accommodation within the dates advertised by the Accommodation Office for returning students).
- · Signpost Mentor
- Open and Visiting Day support

Welsh Medium Study Scholarships

98% of Aberystwyth University graduates who have studied Welsh medium modules are in work or further study six months after graduating.*

To enable more of our students to take advantage of the opportunity to learn new skills which are important to the workplace, Aberystwyth offers Scholarships to help them to follow part of their course through the medium of Welsh.

There is no need to apply for these Scholarships – they will automatically be awarded to eligible students. Details of eligible modules will be available upon registration at the start of each academic year.

Uwch Ysgoloriaeth (Higher Scholarship)

£250 a year

For students taking at least 40 credits through the medium of Welsh each year. Students will need to register on module(s) offered wholly or partly through the medium of Welsh on eligible courses.

Ysgoloriaeth Annog (Motivation Scholarship)

£100 a year

For students taking between 5 credits and 39 credits of Welsh medium module(s) each year. Students will need to register on module(s) offered wholly or partly through the medium of Welsh on eligible courses.

Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol Scholarships



The Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol is an independent body, with responsibilities for planning and funding Welsh medium provision within the entire higher education sector in partnership with all the universities of Wales.

The aim of the Scholarship scheme is to offer financial support to students studying through the medium of Welsh. There are three levels of award, depending on the number of credits available to study through the medium of Welsh. It is possible to hold a Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol Scholarship alongside any Aberystwyth University awards.

William Salesbury Scholarship £5,000 over 3 years

This Scholarship is open to a student who intends to study 100% of their course through the medium of Welsh. Please see the Coleg website for details of how to apply.

Main Scholarships £1,000 a year

The Main Scholarship scheme is for students studying for degrees which include at least 240 credits through the medium of Welsh. In order to be eligible for the Main Scholarship, students must study at least 80 credits through the medium of Welsh each year. These Scholarships are worth £3,000 over three years (where a course includes three years of studying in Aberystwyth and a year abroad/work experience year, that year will not be paid). How to apply

The Main Scholarships will be allocated on the basis of Aberystwyth University's Entrance Scholarship Examinations. You must become a member of the Coleg to apply.

The application form is available on the Coleg website. You must return the form to the Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol by the date given, ensuring that you have completed the Aberystwyth University appendix.

Incentive Scholarships

£500 a year

The Incentive Scholarship scheme is for students studying for degrees which include at least 120 credits through the medium of Welsh in an eligible subject. In order to be eligible for the Incentive Scholarship, students must study at least 40 credits through the medium of Welsh each year.

These Scholarships are worth £1,500 over three years (where a course includes three years of studying in Aberystwyth and a year abroad/

work experience year/foundation year, that year will not be paid).

A list of eligible courses can be found on the Coleg website. The Scholarships are awarded on the basis of the content of the application form.

How to apply

You must become a member of the Coleg to apply. You can download an application form from the Coleg website. It must be returned to the Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol by the closing date advertised on their website.

Important Information to Note:

- It is possible to hold an Entrance Scholarship or Merit Award together with any, or all, of the other awards we offer.
- Each Scholarship and Bursary has its own terms and conditions.
- Students deferring their entry will be entitled to receive Scholarships/Bursaries at the level publicised for the year of application (rather than the year of entry in the case of deferred applications).
- Payments will continue for the tenure of the award subject to continued eligibility (payments are not made during repeat years, with the exception of the Aberystwyth Bursary).
- Awards are paid whilst students are registered as full-time and full fee-paying. Payments will not be made during years abroad, years in employment, sandwich years etc.
- 6. Most payments are made twice annually direct into students' bank accounts. It is the award holders' responsibility to provide valid bank details when requested to do so. Failure to provide bank details by the specified date will result in payments being withheld. Where bank details have not been provided by the specified date, the award holder will not be entitled to receive that year's payment. Subsequent years' payments may continue if the award holder provides their bank details by the specified date in subsequent years.
- Payments for students who temporarily withdraw will resume from the start of the next full term in which they recommence their studies (any remaining payment from the term in which they withdrew will not be repaid).
- Please note that if you become indebted to the University, Scholarship and Bursary payments will be withheld and set against any outstanding debt.
- 9. If a student permanently withdraws from their studies before 1st December, the entire first instalment of any award will be reclaimed by the Finance Department. If a student permanently withdraws from their studies between 1st December and 2nd March, the entire second instalment of any award will be reclaimed by the Finance Department. Failure to repay any award in such an instance could result in a referral to the University's debt collection agency.
- 10. The information contained in this brochure is only applicable to applicants who will undertake their studies in Aberystwyth, and does not apply to students studying franchised or validated programmes delivered by our partners.
